MOGO GOLD RUSH COLONY CAMP

The students of Windellama Public School along with their TREC school peers had a fantastic time at camp. The children enjoyed a fully immersive experience as they lived and breathed the life of the Australian Colonial Goldfields. The schools were treated to an array of amazing demonstrations, roleplaying and activities that all simulated what life was like during the Australian Gold Rush.





Students were given the opportunity to pan for gold (which enabled a lot of them to actually find small pieces of gold), be students in a primary school classroom in the 1800s, watch blacksmiths and wood turners work, and visit a variety of temporary permanent and housing structures that populated the Mogo Gold Rush Colony site.

In the 1800s classroom students got a taste of what life was like in the past when students went to school. The school headmaster explained what the children were expected to do and the TREC students were put through their paces.



Afterwards the children made their own damper for afternoon tea before returning to their rooms and the surrounds for some playtime and to get ready for the evening bushdance.



The girls were fortunate and skilled enough to place in a number barrell racing competions at rodeos and barrell days throughout the Queensland rodeo circuit.



Chyanne placed 5th at Georgetown, 4th at Charters Towers and 1st at Collinsville for barrell racing. At both Charters Towers and Collinsville Chyanne raced in the Under 8s, however at Georgetown she raced in the Under 11s division.
