

Like last year, I was able to go to Aurora College's residential, and this year it was in Katoomba, Blue Mountains, Because Aurora is a virtual school, it was even more fun seeing everyone in my class in real life! We also saw live CCTV footage of Australia's one and only nuclear reactor, OPAL! It was a long day, but when we got back to the place we were staying at, CCC Camps, we got to have a campfire and listen to Aboriginal elders teach us about their culture and stories.

Afterwards we also got to toast marshmallows around the campfire! On Thursday though, we didn't travel anywhere, but instead got to do adventure activities at the campsite. There were activities such as archery, vertical ropes, laser tag, a flying fox and crate climbing. My group got to do crate climbing, the flying fox and laser tag which was so much fun! But on Friday it was time to say goodbye to classmates, friends and teachers. I had so much fun though, it was definitely worth the 3 ¾ hour bus ride there and back!
